What is a Baccalaureate Service?

A Baccalaureate Service is a chance for graduating seniors, parents, family, and friends to recognize, acknowledge, and celebrate, at this particular moment, God's presence in our lives. It is a chance to prayerfully reflect on the past four years and joyfully give thanks for the many blessings that have been bestowed upon us. Since there are many different religious traditions represented in the senior class, the CHS Baccalaureate is an Interfaith Service which incorporates prayers, sacred scripture, songs, symbols, and rituals from the traditions that are represented by the committee members.

The term "baccalaureate" is derived from two Latin words, *bacca*, or "berry," and *laureus*, "laurel," which might refer to the wreaths of laurel with which new graduates were crowned in European ceremonies of the medieval period. The Baccalaureate service has long been associated with the commencement exercises of schools in the United States.

How long has this been a tradition in the Chathams?

The tradition of a Baccalaureate Service began in the 1980's with a combined effort of Chatham Borough High School and the Chatham Interfaith Council (CIC). As the CIC grew and the Borough and Township merged high schools, this tradition continued. In the mid 1990's, when the Youth Interfaith Council (YIC) became more defined and organized, the service was then passed on to the YIC.

Who plans the service?

The YIC invites two graduating seniors from each faith community in the Chathams to serve on the planning committee. They then invite seniors from other faiths to join the team. The students are empowered to work together with faith leaders and members of the YIC to create a service each year that is unique and meaningful to them.

Our 2021 inspiration:

This year's theme is "DON'T STOP BELIEVIN' - Our Journey is Just Beginning." As we emerge from a global pandemic and are on the verge of stepping into our futures, we found inspiration in the classic song by Journey. While acknowledging the sometimes monotonous and crushing nature of everyday life, the song injects a message of positivity and hope, and urges us to remember that we are each unique and special in our own ways, with the power to break free from what holds us down, to explore places we've never been. As we journey on, let's hold on to that feeling.
